DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS FOLLOWING BREAST SURGERY

1. <u>Activity</u>

- Walking is highly encouraged. If you feel weak, pleases have someone with you at all times while moving about, for assistance.
- Use your Incentive Spirometer 10X every half hour without fail if you have been given one.
- NO HEAVY lifting (10lbs. or more) for 2-3 weeks.
- Good nutrition is important for wound healing.
- You may shower after 48 hours. Pat breast/nipple area dry. DO NOT WIPE or RUB.
- Sleep in a recliner or in bed with several pillows. Do not lay flat for 4 days.

2. <u>Medication</u>

 Antibiotics, nausea medication and pain medication will be prescribed, please take as directed.

3. <u>Wound Care</u>

- You may have drains placed at the time Your drain may be removed on the day following your surgery or it may need to remain in place longer. Dr. Gerzenshtein will make that determination, and let you know immediately after surgery. If the drain remains, you will be instructed on drain care. When the drain is removed, you may have some drainage from the drain site for 24 hours after the drains are removed. This is normal. Apply 4X4 gauze over the drain site openings to catch any drainage.
- Dressings will be reapplied after the drains are removed.
- Dr. Gerzenshtein may use dissolvable or permanent sutures. If permanent sutures are used they will be removed at 2 different office visits. Nipple/Areola sutures will be removed 7 days after surgery. Sutures under the breasts will be removed in 14 days.
- Wear the surgical bra as directed. You may purchase a new bra when okayed by Dr. Gerzenshtein.
- Swelling, bruising, tenderness, redness and some drainage are <u>normal</u>.
 EXCESSIVE amounts of drainage and redness are not normal, and should be reported to Dr. Gerzenshtein.

4. <u>Call Your Dr. Gerzenshtein If You Have</u>

- ✤ Pus-like or foul smelling drainage.
- ✤ Temperature greater than 100 degrees.
- Excessive bleeding or drainage
- Increased pain that is not tolerable
